The Museum of Modern Art, 11 West 53d Street, New York, has borrowed for its Retrospective Exhibition of the Works of Maurice Sterne, which will open on February 15th, three paintings: Two Girls Seated on a Wall, Girl Sleeping, and Green Bowl, Tulips from the collection of Mrs. Meredith Hare of Colorado Springs.

The Sterne Exhibition is the first major one-man show by an American artist to be arranged by the Museum of Modern Art. A second American one-man show of the works of Edward Hopper is scheduled for next season.

Mr. Sterne has just returned from Anticoli-Corrado, Italy, where he has been at work for the past six months, bringing with him his most recent paintings and sculpture, which will have their first showing in the coming exhibition.

The exhibition, which will include paintings, drawings, and sculpture, will reflect Mr. Sterne's varied and wide travels: in Bali, which he "discovered" long before it became a goal for tourists; in India, where he watched and sketched Ganges life for many months from a raft on the river; in Italy; in New Mexico; and in other parts of the world.
