SYMPOSIUM AND EDUCATION PROGRAMS TO ACCOMPANY  
TOULOUSE-LAUTREC EXHIBITION

The Museum of Modern Art will present an evening symposium as well as daily educational activities in conjunction with the exhibition, HENRI DE TOULOUSE-LAUTREC, on view at the Museum through January 26, 1986. The schedule is as follows:

## SYMPOSIUM

Lautrec and the 1890s: Art and Society  
Tuesday, December 3, 8:00 p.m.

The role of the artist as printmaker in fin-de-siècle French society will be discussed by experts in the field of nineteenth-century art. Panelists are Douglas Druick, Prince Trust Curator of the Department of Prints and Drawings at The Art Institute of Chicago; Linda Nochlin, CUNY Distinguished Professor of Art History at the Graduate School of the City University of New York; and Victor Brombert, Professor of Comparative Literature at Princeton University. Moderator is Riva Castleman, Director of the Department of Prints and Illustrated Books at the Museum and coordinator of the exhibition.

Admission to the symposium, which will be held in The Roy and Niuta Titus Theater I, is \$7 for the public, \$6 for Museum members, and \$5 for students with valid identification.
