MUSEUM OF MODERN ART ANNOUNCES ELECTION OF TWO NEW OFFICERS

Stephen C. Clark, Chairman of the Board of Trustees of the Museum of Modern Art, announces that the Board at its June meeting elected David H. McAlpin, Treasurer, and Frances Hawkins, Secretary, of the Museum.

Mr. McAlpin, elected a member of the Board in April of this year, has been Chairman of the Museum's Committee on Photography since last fall and was one of those most active in establishing a Department of Photography for the Museum in December 1940. Mr. McAlpin is a trustee of the New York Zoological Society, a director of the New York Orchestral Association, and a member of the University Club, the Grolier Club, the Metropolitan Opera Club, and the Downtown Association.

Mr. McAlpin is a special partner of the firm of Clark, Dodge and Company. He is also trustee of the Texas Pacific Land Trust and director of a number of investment companies. He was born at Mt. Pleasant, New York, and was graduated from Princeton in 1920, where the next year he received a Master's Degree. From Harvard in 1924 he received the degree of LL.B.

Miss Hawkins, who has been Acting Secretary of the Museum for several months, is a native of Denver, Colorado. She was educated at the Wolcott School for Girls in that City and at the Ethel Walker School, Simsbury, Connecticut. From the University of Denver she received her A.B. in 1927 and M.A. the next year in sociology and political science. She later did graduate work at the Pulitzer School of Journalism, Columbia University.
